Dear Brothers & Sisters,

The 2020 General election is just 8 days away, and it is more important than ever that you make your voice heard and vote! While Local 290 continues to work with our elected leaders at every level of government, we must all be sure to vote to ensure leaders who stand with us are elected.

Election day is November 3, 2020.

Ballots have mailed in both Oregon & Washington, and you should have received yours. If you have not, you can contact your local county elections office.

Make a plan to return your ballot ASAP by mail or at a drop box. The last day to safely mail your ballot in Oregon is October 27, 2020. After that date you should return your ballot to a drop box to ensure it arrives in time. You can find drop box locations through your local county elections office.

In Washington your ballot will be counted if it is postmarked up to election day, but you should still plan on turning it in early.

We have seen and worked to overcome many challenges this year, and we know there will be many more issues and fights ahead. It is critical that we help shape the future of our families, communities, and union through the democratic process, and that we make sure the needs of working men and women are met.

The Union will never tell you how to vote. But after an intensive endorsement process we know these candidates will work with us to protect our wages, hours, and working conditions.

I hope that no matter how you choose to vote, you will send in your ballot and make your voice heard this November.
